The family calendar for two homes

Your parenting plan, on a calendar both of you and the kids can read. Changes you both agree to. A record that holds up.

The order becomes the calendar

Enter the schedule once (2-2-3, week on/week off, or your own pattern) with holidays by even and odd year and school breaks. Quilt writes it through next year and shows whose house it is in each parent's color.

Changes are requests, answered in one tap

Need a night covered? Tap the days and send. The other parent accepts, counters, or hands over different days. Agreed changes lock and show on both calendars, with who agreed and when.

A record nobody can edit

Every request, answer, message and expense is stamped by the server the moment it happens and cannot be changed or deleted. Any date range exports as a court-ready PDF with a fingerprint that proves it is unaltered.

Expenses, settled in the open

Snap a receipt; the amount, date and category fill in. Set the split, send a batch, approve line by line, mark paid with the confirmation attached.

The kids stay out of the middle

Pair a kid's phone or tablet with a six-digit code. Their Quilt shows whose house it is, the week and their chores. No account, and nothing about the grown-ups' arrangements.

Messages that stay calm

One thread with the other parent, read receipts, and a tone check that offers a calmer version of a heated draft with the same facts.

What it costs

30 days free, then \$79 a year or \$9.99 a month. One price covers both parents and every kid. Families under one roof use Quilt free.

Sign in with Apple, Google or an emailed link. No password. iPhone, iPad and the web; kid devices by code.

How to start

1. Go to app.quilt.day/start?source=onepager on your phone or computer.
2. Enter your family, pick your schedule, add the holidays from your order.
3. Invite the other parent by email. They sign in and see the same calendar.
